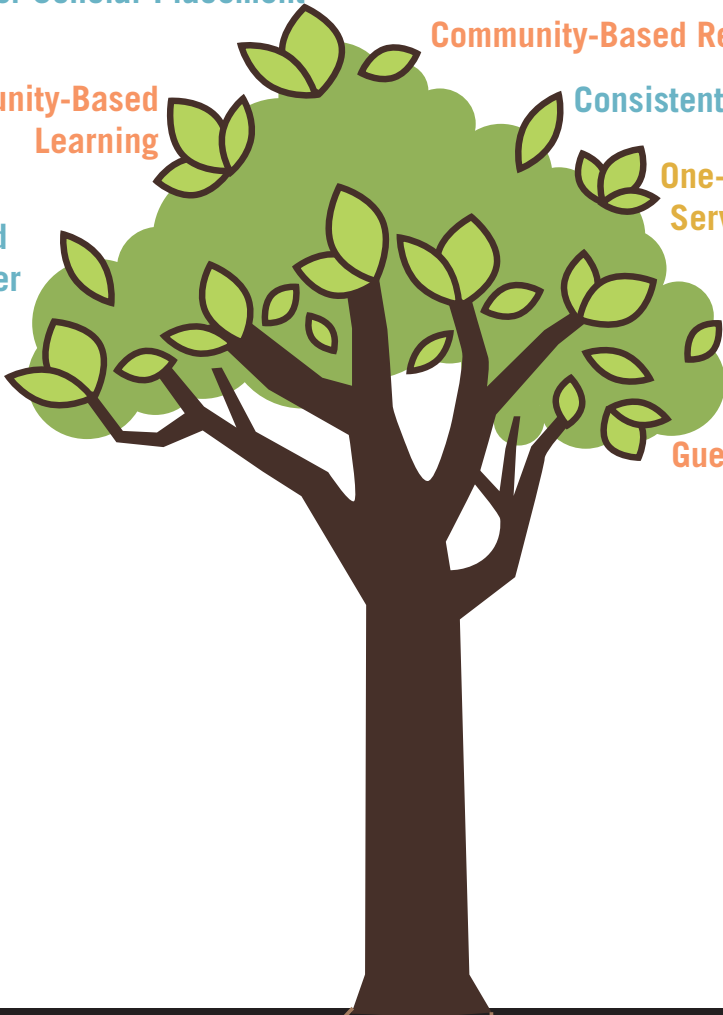

Bonner Scholar Placement

Bonner Scholars are matched with nonprofits, schools, and government agencies that align with their interests in social issues and, for four years, volunteer 10 hours a week at one organization in exchange for financial assistance. They also participate in on-campus reflective exercises and educational programming to understand difference, power, and privilege; deepen their thinking about complex social issues; and prepare for active citizenship.

Community-Based Learning (CBL) & Research

CBL courses and research projects fully integrate classroom and community elements. Projects respond to community-identified needs.

Funded Summer Fellow

The CCE supports four summer Civic Fellowship Programs that provide funding for students completing otherwise-unpaid academically grounded 8-10-week internships in the nonprofit or government sectors. The CCE also sponsors the Urban Education Fellowship which provides funding for selected students serving at Richmond nonprofits providing summer enrichment opportunities for youth.

One-Time Service Project

The CCE facilitates connections between community organizations and students, faculty, and staff for one-time service opportunities.
